Point/Theme (stated in introduction) <i>Psalms 100 is about worshipping God, but we don't naturally want to worship God. Psalms 100 itself tells us how we can become motivated to worship God.</i>			
Sermon Outline I. <i>Psalms 100 calls us to worship God.</i> A. <i>Verses 1, 2, and 4.</i> B. <i>God calls all people to worship Him (Psalms 47, 42 and Romans 1)</i> II. <i>We don't inherently want to worship God because of our sin.</i> A. <i>We would rather follow false gods, false teachers and our own sinful ways.</i> B. <i>We think we're the "measure of all things."</i> C. <i>Scripture disagrees and shows us our folly.</i> III. <i>If we understand who God is and what He's done for us, we will want to worship Him.</i> A. <i>God is the highest God (name is Yahweh, not Baal, etc.).</i> B. <i>God is good, steadfast in love, and faithful.</i> C. <i>God redeems us in Jesus Christ.</i> D. <i>Now that we know God and His character and what He's done for us in Christ, we will seek to worship Him.</i>			
Conclusion A. <i>I've been created in God's image to worship Him alone but sin causes me not to want to worship Him.</i> B. <i>Because God is the creator, provider and redeemer, I want to worship Him! He made me, saved me and is sanctifying me. I belong to Him alone! Because of who God is and what He has done, I want to worship Him alone.</i>
